## Baby Teeth Wobble



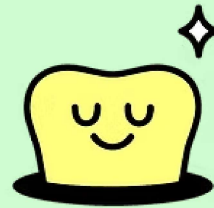
Baby teeth sometimes get wobbly like jelly and then fall out.

## New Teeth Arrive



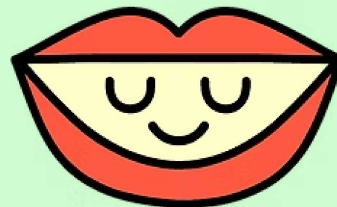
New teeth are stronger and help me eat and smile as I get bigger.
