### How can parents help children organize their pencil case?

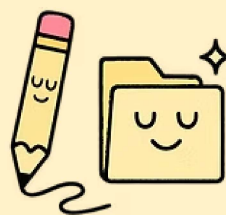
Parents can help by including essential writing tools, maintenance items like erasers and sharpeners, and any comfort items that help the child feel calm and ready to learn.

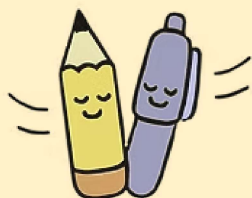

## Little Tools, Big Ideas



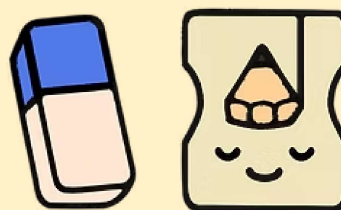
A pencil case holds tools for writing, drawing, and organising.
