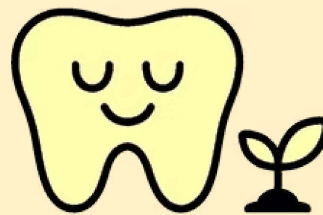

Making Space



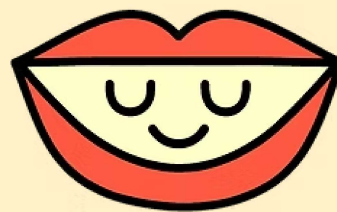
When a tooth says goodbye, it makes space so my smile can keep growing strong.
